PROJECT OVERVIEW

What would the world look like if states centered peace, gender equality and environmental integrity in their foreign policy? <u>Feminist foreign policy</u> strives to imagine and build that world.

The Global Partner Network for Feminist Foreign Policy (the Network) is a growing informal global network of over 30 governments and civil society organizations dedicated to the advancement of feminist foreign policies. Founded on diverse partnerships and intersectional feminist principles, calls for Network bold solutions unprecedented crises. The Network creates opportunities for stakeholders to engage in joint advocacy, outreach, research and learning. Its main purpose is to deepen understanding about the ideas, policies, collaboration opportunities and partners working to advance feminist foreign policies in a range of global contexts and to identify concrete actions and timelines to move this agenda forward.



ORGANISATION PRESENTATION

The Feminist Foreign Policy Collaborative (the Collaborative) is a new shared space where feminists inside and outside of government can work together to ensure feminist foreign policies are ambitious, transformative and effectively implemented. Launched in 2023, the Collaborative now manages the activities of the Network, as well as the domestic efforts of the Coalition for a Feminist Foreign Policy in the United States.



OBJECTIVES WITH THE SCUP

The objectives of the Network are ambitious, progressive and human-centered. Through participation in the SCUP program, the Network strives to:

- Grow its membership, connecting civil society and government leaders of the global feminist foreign policy movement.
- Prioritize feminist solutions in policy debates on security, development, migration, trade, aid and more.
- Support governments' formulation and adoption of feminist foreign policy and amplify civil society's participation through co-creative processes.
